

Name: Frederic Chopin (1810-1849)

Born: March I, 1810 in Zelazowa, Poland

Died: 1849 - died of tuberculosis.

Music Genre: Classical

Frederic grew up in a middle class

family.



His first composition was at age 7 and began performing and wrote Polonaise in G Minor at age 8 and he later became a piano teacher in Paris, and socialized with high society.

Audiences were enthralled with his highly technical yet poetically expressive performances.

He was considered Poland's greatest composer.








## Binbrook Fair - September 12, 2014

As I walk through Merritt Hall move towards the back of the building I glanced at the cabinets. There were ribbons everywhere. I loved the red ones!


