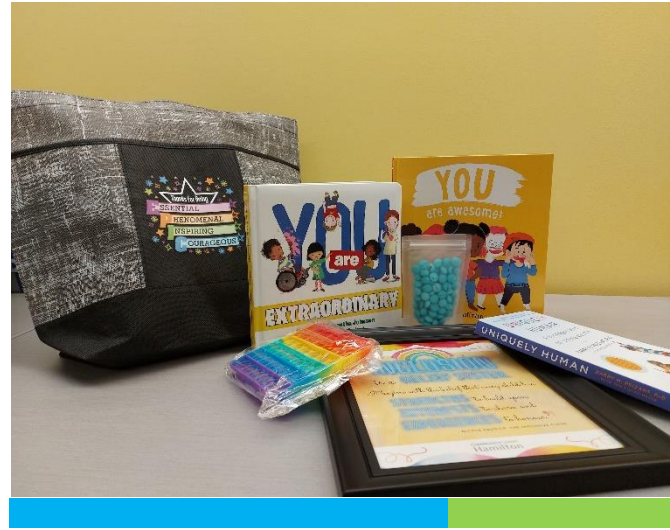
Welcome

SCAFFOLDING ACHIEVEMENTS

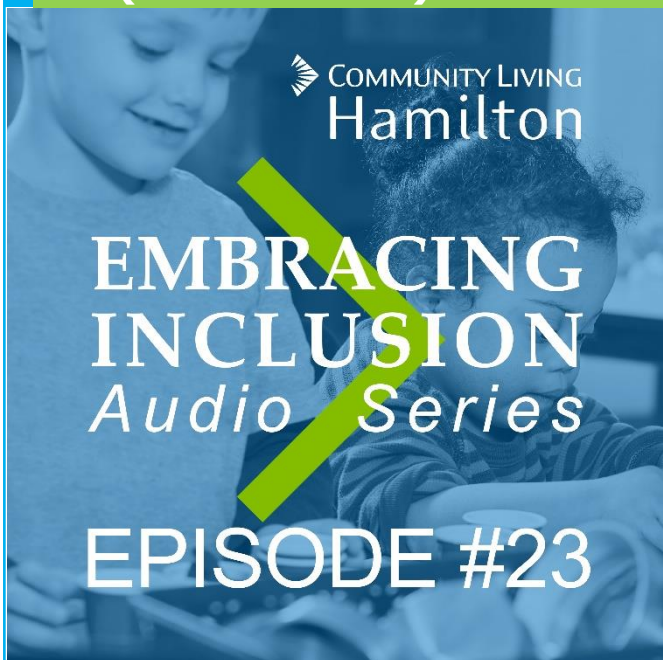
